

What can you study at university?

In school, you get to learn about a lot of different subjects in your lessons. But when you get to university, you can choose to learn about subjects that you don't get to learn about in school. In fact, there are over 50,000 different courses at universities in the UK!

In this worksheet, you'll get to think about which subjects you enjoy now, and learn more about what you can do at university.

Activity One

Activity Three
